## Mandlikova, Garrison Meet in Final

WASHINGTON — Zina Garrison, the 10th-ranked woman tennis player in the world, fought back from a 2-0 deficit in the third set to beat Pam Casale yesterday and join Hana Mandlikova in the finals of the \$150,000 Virginia Slims of Washington Tournament.

After Mandlikova eliminated fellow Czechoslovakian Helena Sukova 6-1, 7-6, Garrison, seeded fifth, earned the right to participate in only the second final of her professional career with a 6-0, 5-7, 5-2 victory over Casale.

Mandlikova, ranked 12th in the world, will be attempting to win a major tournament for the first time in more than two years. The winner of tonight's match will receive \$30,000. Casale could register only eight points in the opening set as both players rubbed the net infrequently content to battle baseline-to-baseline.

Casale turned the match around in the second set. After Garrison broke serve to go up 2-1, Casale broke serve in the fourth, sixth and decisive 12th game to pull even.

"Pam's a real gutsy player," said Garrison. "I started to play her game in the second set. I wasn't hitting through at that point. I just started hitting out in the third set, playing my game, and it worked."

Casale opened the set by holding serve and then breaking Garrison's serve. But from then on it was all Garrison, who avenged a 6-0, 6-9 defeat in the French Open in the only previous meeting between the two right-handers.

Mandlikova, who gained the championship without dropping a set, needed to hold service to tie the second set at 6-all and force the tiebreaker.

In the tiebreaker, won by Mandlikova 7-5, both players held serve until the final point when Sukova committed an unforced error, placing her shot into the net.

"I played well in the first set, but didn't let down. I was fighting out there," said Mandlikova. Helena started to serve better and put more pressure on me."

The victory was Mandlikova's fourth in as many meetings between the two.

**Connors Gains Lite Final**

Fibak won the first set with a 7-4 tiebreaker after a lengthy hour and fifteen minutes.

Connors came back for an easy 6-1 triumph in the second set and then had to struggle to finally put away the match, which lasted 2½ hours.

Connors will face the winner of the Ivan Lendl-Andres Gomez semifinal match today in a best-of-five match for the \$100,000 top prize.

### Bourne Wins in BP Western

PERTH, Australia — Lloyd Bourne of the United States cruised to a straight set semifinal victory over 1982 runnerup Craig Miller of Australia in the \$42,500 BP Western Australian Open tournament.

The top seed from Los Angeles beat Miller 7-5, 6-3 and faces South African Brian Levine in today's final.

In the second semifinal, the little-known Levine defeated Australian John Frawley 6-2, 6-4.

### Kuharsky Upset in Toronto

TORONTO — Bill Cowan of Canada stunned top-seeded Zoltan Kuharsky of Switzerland 7-6 (7-5), 6-4 Friday in second-round action at a Circuit Alcan tennis tournament.

Kuharsky was the only seeded player to fall during the day's action. Third-seeded Bud Schultz of Boston breezed past Simon Bartram of Canada 6-3, 6-4 and fourth-seeded Bob Green of Boston ousted Canadian Robert Hale 7-6 (7-3), 6-3.

### Ginny Final Set

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Pam Teeguarden and Jenny Klitch won their semifinal matches to reach the finals of the \$50,000 Ginny of Nashville tournament.

Teeguarden, 32, of Los Angeles pulled out a three-set victory over 18-year-old Anna Maria Cecchini of Italy 6-1, 4-6, 6-3.

Klitch, 18, of Columbus, Ohio, defeated Kathleen Cummings, 22, of Richmond, Va., 6-3, 6-1.
